PROUD HISTORY

The Union League Club was founded in 1879 to encourage patriotism, as well as support the U.S. government and enhance the social, civic, and cultural framework of the community. Our history is a significant part of the spirit that the Club embodies, and continues to distinguish us from other private clubs locally, nationwide and throughout the world.

Club members were instrumental in such important cultural events and projects as the staging and planning of the 1893 Columbian Exposition, the founding of the Art Institute of Chicago, Chicago Symphony Orchestra and the Auditorium Theater, and the building of the Harold Washington Library Center.

Philanthropy is also a strong aspect of the Club's proud tradition. Since 1919, the Union League Boys and Girls Clubs have offered thousands of underprivileged children daily enrichment programs at four inner-city clubs and summer camp opportunities. The Union League Civic & Arts Foundation has provided scholarships and grants to individuals and organizations to further creative efforts in the arts and civic endeavors for more than 50 years. The Chicago Engineers' Foundation provides incentive grants that help launch careers in engineering.
